Has your child been diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder (ASD)?

Children between the ages of 6-14 years old, with average or above-average intellectual functioning, who experience difficulty with social communication and functioning may be eligible to participate in a research study investigating the assessment of children's social skills and peer relationships.

Testing takes place at the Rush NeuroBehavioral Center and involves:

- Two 3-hour sessions
- Assessment of your child's ability to perceive, interpret and reason about social information
- Completion of questionnaires regarding your child's social and emotional learning skills
- No fee for assessment
- Feedback report to parents
