Ruth Cross, M.S.

Ruth Cross was an educator for 34 years, spending 15 years in the classroom before becoming a building principal for Naperville School District 203 in 1989. She became an assistant superintendent in 2004 and retired in 2007. Cross now serves as an SEL trainer and project manager for the Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning (CASEL) and DuPage County Regional Office of Education

(ROE) Partnership, designed to develop a regional model for SEL implementation that can be replicated in other states. Her work with the Partnership includes coaching DuPage County school districts that are implementing the SEL standards, and leading workshops around the state on the importance of teaching these standards to students as a means of developing skills that promote success in school and life.

Cross co-chaired the DuPage Anti-Bullying Task Force Best Practices Committee in 2010-2011. She is currently working to implement the Committee's recommendations in several DuPage County school districts.

Program Overview

This professional development workshop is designed around social and emotional learning (SEL) content and process, incorporating strategies that promote SEL and maximize learning—as well as model activities that engage stakeholders around the benefits of systemic SEL. In addition to reviewing current research that delineates the connection between SEL and academic achievement, positive student development, and reductions in negative behaviors, workshop topics include how SEL is taught and learned, the importance of developing adult SEL competencies, and how to integrate SEL into other school district initiatives. Participants will learn how to lead school-wide SEL implementation and facilitate learning activities in their district and /or school.

Upon completion of this workshop, participants will be able to:

- Explain the social emotional competencies and how these connect to academic achievement, positive student development, and reductions in negative student behaviors.
- Describe how social emotional learning (SEL) is taught and learned, and how to integrate SEL into other schools district initiatives.

- Discuss the importance of developing adult social emotional competencies.
- Plan and implement a systemic approach to SEL as part of a district/school improvement process.
